### **BOB ROSS PAINTING PARTY (JUST FOR FUN)**

Learn how to paint happy little trees Bob Ross style. This "Joy of Painting" inspired class will prove that there is no such thing as mistakes. Only "happy little accidents." YouTube and Netflix have a number of full-length episodes of Bob Ross's show. The first thing you need to do is pick your episode. Watch the episode to confirm the materials you'll need to buy. Depending on how many people you have, you'll want to make sure you have plenty of supplies, so when possible, buy in bulk. Since everyone will be painting along to a video, let them know they can signal you to pause or rewind the episode. At the end of the party, the paintings will still be very wet. Offer to let the paintings dry overnight and be picked up later. This will provide you with another opportunity to see your clients and thank them for coming.

### -WHO TO INVITE -

This party is for chill people of all ages. If you have any clients who are introverts, this is the perfect event for them. With the focus being on painting, they won't feel pressure to socialize the entire time.

### TIMING -

A Bob Ross Painting Party can be held any time of the year. But we like the idea of hosting it in April because it's "Keep America Beautiful Month" and Bob was all about the trees and clouds.

### VENUE-

Host your party at home or your neighborhood clubhouse. Anywhere your guests have enough room to spread out and paint.
