MILITARY CARE PACKAGES (COMMUNITY)

Help provide care packages to deployed American military heroes around the world by hosting a packing party. These events are a lot of fun and appreciated by the active military members who receive them. The best items to pack inside a care package include high-quality socks, drink mixes, protein bars, condiments, snacks, toiletries, and entertainment items. Assign items to your guests so everyone brings something to contribute. Make sure you seal everything in plastic zip-lock bags to keep items fresh and protected from the elements. For safety reasons, you can't send care packages to "any soldier" so ask friends and family who they know serving overseas. Another option is to reach out to the closest military base and find out how you can support troops in need. They'll gladly give you information. If you need boxes, consider grabbing the free at the post office. The 12 x 12 x 5 boxes can be packed as heavy as you'd like and shipped for a low flat rate. And don't forget to include hand-written notes to the soldiers thanking them for their service.

WHO TO INVITE -

Invite friends, family, neighbors, co-workers, and anyone else you think would like to participate.

– TIMING –

Sending military care packages is appreciated year-round. However, you may want to consider scheduling your packing party in mid-June so they can be shipped in time for the 4th of July holiday. It can take about 10-14 days for the soldiers to receive mail overseas.

-VENUE —

Host your packing party around your kitchen table at home. Or, if you have a larger group, consider having it at your office or reserve a private room at an area church or community center.
