TIMING This is a "one night only" event. Put it on your schedule for December 31st. Since this event lasts until midnight, we recommend starting it around 8:00 pm. VENUE Host your New Year's Eve party at home or reserve a venue. Hotel ballrooms and area restaurants can be great choices for this event. AGENDA

Icebreaker

Help your guests get to know each other with an easy icebreaker. When people check-in, place a sticky note on their back with the name of a historical figure. Instruct them to ask others yes and no questions about who they are until they guess correctly.

Music

Create a playlist, hire a DJ or a band to keep the music going all night long. Make sure you mix in some favorite party tunes like "Raise Your Glass" by Pink, or "New Year's Day" by U2. And don't forget to play "Auld Lang Syne" at midnight.
