

VISION BOARD PARTY (JUST FOR FUN)

A vision board is a collage that uses the law of attraction to bring more of what you want into your life. Think of it as a Pinterest board you can carry around with you or hang on the wall in your office to remind you of what you want to manifest. Gather a group of like-minded individuals to create vision boards featuring cut-out pictures and phrases from magazines and other embellishments that will represent their goals. Encourage your guests to keep their boards in a place where they can see it daily and assess what they need to do to make their dreams come true in the New Year. And if a new home is on their wish list, make sure they know you're the perfect agent to help them find it.

WHO TO INVITE

Vision board parties are appealing to individuals who embrace the law of attraction and believe in the power of positivity. Focus on inviting people you believe will welcome this experience and be willing to share their hopes and dreams with others. We suggest a smaller group for this party so everyone can sit together around a kitchen or dining room table.

TIMING

Vision boards are all about setting goals for the coming year. We recommend scheduling in December or January.

VENUE

Select a venue where you have ample workspace for your guests. This may be at your home, or at a local restaurant or coffee shop where you can reserve an area for your event. Most restaurants will provide you with a private room with minimum food or drink order.

AGENDA

If you want your party to go off without a hitch, it's good to have a plan. We recommend following this agenda to keep your evening on track.

Icebreaker

When you show up at a party and don't know anyone, it can feel awkward. Help your guests out by incorporating an icebreaker that will allow them to get to know each other. This will also help put them in the proper mindset for creating their vision board.

- ☐ Talk about goals each person wants to achieve in the New Year
- ☐ Have people share a bucket list item with the group

Music

Playing music in the background can help to set the tone for your event. Consider creating an inspirational playlist ahead of time with music you think your guests will enjoy. Include songs like "Just the Way You Are" by Bruno Mars or "Here Comes the Sun" by the Beatles. Also, check out Spotify's playlists featuring uplifting songs.
